- B. Fire Chief's Report Reviewed by the Board. Report on file.
 - A proposed development for the area just west of Station 292 exists. I do not have an anticipated start date. The preliminary plan is attached.
 - Vail School District sought input about the new Rocking K School for apparatus access, FDC locations, and Knox box locations. We had a productive meeting.
 - 293 Land Counteroffer for asking price.
 - Rural Metro Fire may be removing ambulances; we have prioritized having a third ambulance in service.
 - The BC truck that we ordered has been delivered.
 - Crews attended several community events.
 - 59 new housing permits were issued.
 - We had 246 incidents and 93 transports in November.
- C. November's Financial Reports Review, discussion, and possible action of the district's financial status, including monthly summary reports for November 2023. Gabe Buldra with JVG presented November's financial report.

Key points:

- Revenues for the month of November were \$1,403,163, which was \$547,444 over budget.
 - o Pima County revenue for November is \$1,234,354, which is \$469,512 over budget.
 - Non-Tax Levy revenue for November is \$168,808, which is \$77,931 over budget.
- Expenses for the month of November were \$644,153, which was \$86,946 under budget.
- Fiscal year revenue is \$3,969,305, which is over budget by \$625,917 and 56.96% of total annual budget.
 - The district received \$267,605 in ARPA funding in the month of September.
- Fiscal year expense is \$2,577,481, which is under budget by \$328,606 and 36.99% of total annual budget.

A. 2024-034 – Review and possibly discuss the Ambulance Revenue & Cost Recovery Report.

• The Ambulance Revenue and Cost Recovery Report is required by the Arizona Department of Health Services (AZDHS). The FY 2022-2023 report is attached for your review.

We include all ambulance-associated expenses in the report such as maintenance, personnel, administration costs, and bad debt. AZDHS sets ambulance transport rates and the District applies for a rate increase each year. The current transport rate is \$1,853.98 and became effective April 7, 2023. District residents are not billed for costs that are not covered by their health insurance (\$123,042).

FY 22-23 Total Operating Revenue \$1,345,555 up from last year (\$1,088,678) FY 22-23 Total Operating Expenses \$2,057,506 up from last year (\$1,653,697) FY 22-23 Total Operating Loss \$711,951, up from last year (\$565,019)

B. 2024-035 - Review, discussion, and possible action to approve outfitting the new 2023 Ford F-150.

The new battalion chief vehicle has come in, and we must outfit the truck with emergency lighting, graphics, etc.

Gathering additional information to have the Arizona Department of Corrections do the graphics. Chief Tucker is waiting for the remaining bids—\$ 22,324 over budget in Capital.
