- Chief Kahle purchased iPads for Board Members to use when attending Board Meetings.
- The use of Ketamine has become a hot topic in this nation. BC Yalen, Dr Curry (base hospital physician), and Chief Kahle, reviewed our protocols to ensure Ketamine use is not a problem for RVFD. We are recommending some additional continuing education training for all of our paramedics.
- Chief Kahle attended a Pima Chiefs Executive Board meeting and found out we will be able to receive some CARES funding from Pima County. Funds are limited to PPE, cleaning supplies, and personnel backfill. This funding should offset the funding requested from AFG-S.
- We initiated a new program in which we are placing PM/Meds 299 in quarters at Corona de Tucson Station 182 during high peak time hours. This is to help reduce our CON response times.

8. New Business

- A. 2021-013 Review, discussion, and possible action to approve Resolution #21-020 to accept the 2019 FEMA's Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant Award and to authorize the chief to hire three additional firefighters.
 - On August 21, 2020 FEMA notified us that the Rincon Valley Fire District was awarded \$585,111.78 for the 2019 SAFER Grant. The grant provides 100% of the three firefighters salaries and benefits for the 36 months of the award. This grant does not require a match, but we will be responsible for any increase in costs, such as merit raises, benefits, etc. The acceptance of this grant will save District taxpayers \$585,000 over the next 3.5 years. This grant will allow us to improve our service to the community and narrow the gap as

identified in the CRA-SOC on firefighter staffing. This grant will allow us to maintain 12 person minimum staffing and should allow us to increase the average daily staffing. We plan to normally staff both engines with 4 personnel (unless sick, vacations, education, etc). We hope this will increase our average engine staffing from 3.2 to 3.7. The 2020/21 Budget estimates \$239,000 in grant revenue on line 4320 and we have a grant expense offset of \$297,000 on line 5840. Funds received and expended will be processed through those two lines. This will impact budget years 20/21, 21/22, 22/23 and 23/24. The grant award is \$585,000.

- Motion by Member Spears, second by Member Klasen to approve Resolution #21-020 to accept the 2019 FEMA's Staffing for Adeequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant Award and to authorize the Fire Chief to hire three additional firefighters. Motion passed 5 to 0.
- B. 2021-014 Review, discussion and possible action to approve Resolution # 21-021 to accept the 2019 FEMA's Fire Prevention and Safety (FP&S) Grant Award.
 - FEMA notified us on September 2, 2020 that the Rincon Valley Fire District was awarded \$36,964.00 for the 2019 FP&S Grant. The grant provides 95% of the expenses of the grant (\$35,203.91). This grant does require a 5% match (1,760.19). The acceptance of this grant will save District taxpayers approximately \$35,000 in wages and materials while improving our public's safety in accordance with CRA-SOC and our Strategic Plan.

Specific goals are:

Goal 1: Implement a print campaign for 1,500 residents in the communities Geographic Planning Zone 3, identified as high risk in our Community Risk Assessment. Goal 2: Certify a total of 4 personnel, one on each shift and an additional wildland team lead, through the NFPA Certified Wildfire Mitigation Specialist program. Initiate training from Ready, Set, Go and receive free local training for FD personnel from Firewise. Goal 3: Implement a wildfire home assessment program. For the initial campaign, target homes in the neighborhoods of X9 Ranch and Pistol Hill. Goal 4: Leverage community partnerships to host Firewise and RSG classes for residents. The 2020/21 Budget estimates \$239,000 in grant revenue on line 4320 and we have a grant expense offset of \$297,000 on line 5840. Funds received and expended will be processed through those two lines. This will impact budget years 20/21 and 21/22.
